

Food options in and around the Rio...

As we all know, you can eat and sleep as frugal or as expensive as you wish in Vegas. The move to the Rio is no exception. I have been at the Rio on numerous occasions, most recently June 2012. I found many options for food and entertainment.

When visiting the Rio website, food options range from a \$5 purchase to whatever you want to spend. They have something for everyone and every budget. I urge you to go to the site and explore all the restaurant options and pricing.

A "Billiards Café" is planned within the competition area of the BCAPL championships, so you won't have to leave the tournament area between your matches to get good food.

Also, you have other food options only minutes away at the Palms Resort and the Gold Coast Resort. The food at the Gold Coast is very inexpensive and is literally next door.

The Palms has always been a celebrity studded venue. It is a great upscale party type place and has similar food options as the Rio. The Mexican restaurant inside the Palms is excellent and very reasonably priced. Get the Fajitas there, excellent, I paid \$10.99. The Palms is a max 8-10 minute walk from the west entry doors of the Rio. Check out their web site and menus as well, you'll be glad you did.

The Rio has special passes for buffets; one price gets you into multiple buffets, again explained on their site. You also get great discounts once you sign up for their Players Card. If you gamble, use the card and earn points to redeem for food and purchases. If not, get the card to access discounts. **Either way, a win-win situation!**
